What is Experiential Learning? | Experiential Learning

Effective learning is seen when a person progresses through a cycle of four stages: of (1) having a concrete experience followed by (2) observation of and reflection on that experience which leads to (3) the formation of abstract concepts (analysis) and generalizations (conclusions) which are then (4) used to test a hypothesis in future situations, resulting in new experiences.

Kolb's Learning Styles and Experiential Learning Cycle ...

Kolb and Frye describe experiential learning as a four-part cycle: The learner has concrete experience with the content being taught. The learner reflects on the experience by comparing it to prior experiences. Based on experience and reflection, the learner develops new ideas about the content being taught.

Why Using Experiential Learning With Adults Is Powerful

Experiential learning is the process of learning through experience, and is more specifically defined as "learning through reflection on doing". Hands-on learning can be a form of experiential learning, but does not necessarily involve students reflecting on their product. Experiential learning is distinct from rote or didactic learning, in which the learner plays a comparatively passive role.
